Public Art in the Park Community Discussion Meeting Notes MRTNA General Meeting July 25th, 2017

Goal: Define theme and placement for an art project in the park

With the new KaBOOM playground, the backdrop of the historic Annie Beck House reflecting our heritage and the roadway improvements on both NE 13th and Dixie, we have a lot to draw on for ideas, for themes, for our vision to add public art to Middle River Terrace Park.

Ideal Art Projects:

- An art project should be in a place of high visibility
- It should have broad public access
- It should have multiple uses or activities

Questions discussed:

- -What does the community of Middle River Terrace symbolize/mean to you?
 - Diversity
 - Green and trees foliage lots of nature
 - Peaceful
 - Sanctuary
 - Up and coming urban area
 - Freedom and acceptance
 - Friendly
 - Transitional
- -What does Middle River Terrace Park mean to you? What is its identity?
 - Kids and the playground
 - Welcoming to all
 - All about nature
 - Historic Annie Beck House
 - Athletic activity
 - Restful contemplation new painted picnic tables (thanks to FDOT) and butterfly plant boxes.

THEME

What are themes for art that resonate? What components should it have? Here is the feedback from the community:

- Don't clash with Annie Beck House
- Acknowledge our history in some way
- Incorporate botanicals or transportation as themes
- Encourage activity through art (e.g., sprinkler sculpture)
- Should not be realistic (abstract art preferred)
- Concrete block sculpture (see 13th Street)
- Make any mural contemporary
- Use anti graffiti paint for any mural
- Entrance gateway monument/entrance

PLACEMENT

There are many options for placement of art at the park. Here is what was discussed and suggested:

- Storage locker mural plant shrubbery around the structure. Painting a mural on the storage locker highlights an unappealing structure – rather than draw attention to it with a mural it was suggested we plant shrubbery around the three sides of the building. (Note Parks and Rec have applied a fresh coat of paint.) Per a local horticulturist the four shrubs for consideration are simson stopper, Jamaican caper, cocoplum or a native coffee. They all will do fine.
- Water fountains possible to add one with artistic flair?
- Little Library not discussed but a consideration.
- Fence along the entrance mural unanimous support. The already painted wall at the entrance is the logical choice for a painted mural.
- Sprinkler Sculpture unanimous support, needs further review and possible funding.
- Art along the multiple paths that wind around the park whether this is landscaping or other materials TBD. This would be a wonderful choice to engage the community.

- -Selection of an artist(s)
- -Art presentations for community review
